I. Years of Enrollment:

Minimum years of enrollment: 4 years (5 years for Veterinary Medicine)

Can be extended for 2 more years (excluding 2 years of suspension)

- II. Minimum credits for graduation: <u>128</u> credits (physical education and citizen national defense education are not included).
- III. Courses required by the university
 - 1. Physical Education: 2 credits, not included in the credits for graduation. Extra taken PE course credits will be counted as from other departments, and are limited to a maximum of 2 credits. Athletes with outstanding sports achievements will be handled according to the relevant regulations of the Office of Physical Education and Sports.
 - 2. English Proficiency Requirement: 0 credit.
 - 3. General Education: 28 credits
 - i. Core Competencies: at least 3 credits. International students do not need to take the "Information Literacy" course.
 - i i. Language Competencies: (at least 8 credits)

(1)4 credits of university Chinese language.

(2)Freshman English 4 credits

- iii. Field Competency Courses: At least 10 credits.
- including humanities, social sciences, and natural sciences.
- At least 4 credits of "Integrated Field" courses should be taken.
- National Defense Education courses (nonmandatory) can count up to 1 course towards general education graduation credits. Any additional courses in this category cannot be counted as credits for other departments.
- This department belongs to the Environmental Science academic group. A maximum of 1 course from this group can be counted towards general education graduation credits. Any additional courses from this group cannot be counted as credits for other departments.
 - iv. Excess general education courses cannot be counted as credits for other departments.

- IX. Double major:
- (I) Students pursuing a double major must meet the graduation requirements based on the academic year in which their double major was approved. In addition to completing all required credits for their primary department (institute or degree program), double major students must also complete all professional required course credits of the additional major department (institute or degree program) to qualify for a double major.
- (II) If, after deducting the credits required by their primary department (degree program), an undergraduate student's additional major's professional required course credits still do not reach 40 credits, or if the professional required course credits of the additional major were originally less than 40 credits, the student must fulfill the shortfall with designated elective course credits specified by the additional major department (degree program).

X. Cross-domain expertise:

This department offers courses for undergraduate students. If there is an overlap between cross-disciplinary specialization courses and the required courses or credits of a student's primary department (degree program), double major, minor, or other cross-disciplinary specialization, the shortfall must be fulfilled with relevant elective courses designated by the cross-disciplinary specialization department (degree program) or college.

XI. Admission Requirements: Graduates from foreign equivalent schools with a shorter duration of study than domestic senior high schools and junior colleges, such as graduates from an overseas Form 5 education system, must complete at least an additional 12 credits. The required additional credits and courses are detailed in the attached table.

*The required courses and graduation credit requirements shall be specified by each department according to the curriculum plan.

*If there are no changes to courses or credits, submission is not required every academic year.
